Cost of living

Before you leave for France, it is strongly recommended that you draw up an accurate budget to get an idea of living expenses. Students benefit from certain discounts/deals for university residences, restaurants, public transport and entertainment. You will need an overall monthly budget of between €450 (for university halls of residence) and €700 (private accommodation).
