

Admission procedure

Applicants for study – foreign nationals

for the academic year of 2018/2019

Proving the knowledge of the Czech language

In addition to completing the admission procedure of relevant study programmes and forms of study, the foreign national applicants for study (except for Slovak ones) must prove their knowledge of the Czech language. They can prove the knowledge in the following way:

a) by a secondary school leaving examination (Maturita examination) from the Czech language. The accepted applicants must present a school leaving certificate with the examination from the Czech language during the registration procedure.

OR

b) by passing an examination from the Czech language at the College of Polytechnics Jihlava. The examination will take place on 7th June 2018, 8th August, or 5th September 2018. It is not possible to take the examination on a day other than those specified. The examination consists of a written part and an oral part:

The oral part includes a test aimed at grammar with the use of general vocabulary. The test consists of thirty questions, each with three possible answers, only one of which is correct, and the option “I don’t know/ I will not answer”. A correct answer yields one point; the “I don’t know/I will not answer” option no points, and for an incorrect answer, 0.5 point is subtracted. That means that the student can obtain the maximum of 30 points. The time scope for the test is 30 minutes. A sample test is available at www.vspj.cz.

The aim of the oral examination is to verify the vocabulary range, the grammatical accuracy of spoken performance, understanding spoken language and the ability to interact. Next, the student’s motivation, expectations and immediate needs are identified. A student can obtain up to 20 points from the oral part of the examination. The time scope of this part is up to 15 minutes.

The expected language level to pass the examination from the Czech language is B1, which means the knowledge and correct application of declinations, conjugations of all tenses and the present conditional, the imperative, adjectives and adverbs comparatives and superlatives, the basics of spelling, morphology, and sentence constructions.

Without proving their knowledge of the Czech language in an appropriate way, the applicant cannot be registered for study.

The admission procedure conditions for the academic year of 2018/2019 were approved by the Academic Senate of the College of Polytechnics Jihlava on 20 December 2017.
